The Saviour is referred to as the Paschal Lamb. What is the origin of the word and what does it mean? The word for Passover in the Hebrew language is "PESACH," which is a proper noun. To change the noun into an adjective an "1," or "lamed," is added making the word "PESACH L" which transliterates into the word "Paschal."

The Paschal Lamb refers to the sacrifice represented by the lamb which is to have the following characteristics:

- A) male
- B) unblemished
- C) first born
- D) shedding of the blood.

SPOTLIGHT--IRVING H. COHEN

Dr. Cohen was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. on 28 March, 1923 in an orthodox Jewish family. He was graduated from High School at the age of sixteen and went on to Brooklyn College. While there, he pursued a pre-dental course and also engaged in athletics. He was a varsity swimmer and even dallied in football.

In 1943, Bro. Cohen was accepted at the University of Pennsylvania Dental School from which he graduated in 1946 at the age of 23. He served in the U.S. Public Health Service as a commissioned officer in Ft. Worth, Texas.

The Korean war broke out and Dr. Cohen was asked to serve his country once again. While in Korea, he tried desperately to disprove the Book of Mormon, and then put Moroni 10:3-5 to the test. Promising God that he would do God's will, God answered Bro. Cohen's prayer. Bro. Cohen then knew that the Book of Mormon is indeed the "record of Joseph" as stated in Ezekiel 37:15 and also learned that Jesus Christ is the Messiah. My people, the Jews, are looking forward to His coming, but He has already come once and the time is quickly approaching when he will come again.
