# DETAILED EXAMPLES OF RECORDS IN NECHAMA'S LIST

The records in *Nechama's List* are of two types, depending on the changing of international borders, usually due to war:

• **TYPE ONE**: Jewish records from locations where the national boundaries did not change during the dates covered in the record.

## **EXAMPLES OF TYPE ONE**

TITLE Metrical books, 1867-1918

SUMMARY Births, marriages, divorces, deaths records and account books for the

Jewish community of Astrakhan, Astrakhan, Astrakhan, Russia.

LANGUAGE Hebrew and Russian

SUBJECTS Russia, Astrakhan', Astrakhan', Astrakhan' - Jewish records

TITLE Anyakönyvek, 1853-1881

SUMMARY Jewish records of births, marriages, and deaths, for Kis-Bér (a.k.a. Kisbér),

SUBJECTS Hungary, Komárom, Kis-Bér - Jewish records

TITLE Register der Juden Namenannahme, 1808-1809

SUMMARY Registration of Jews adopting new surnames. Gives previous surnames as

well as the adopted surnames. Forms in French. There is no particular order

to thenames.

LANGUAGE French

SUBJECTS Germany, Preußen, Rheinland, Bonn - Jewish records

Names, Personal – Jewish

• **TYPE TWO**: Records that come from two or more nations. This is necessary if a record is from a city that is located in one nation, then, after war, is located in another.

# **EXAMPLE OF TYPE TWO**

TITLE Metrical books, 1854-1895

SUMMARY Jewish records (births, marriages, divorces, deaths) for Antokol', Vil'na, Vil'na,

Russia that was suburb of Vil'na (known as Antakalnis in Lithuanian); between the war it was under the jurisdiction of Poland and known as Antokol (Wilno-Troki),

Wilno, later became part of Wilno; now part of Vilnius, Lithuania.

# A FEW ADDITIONAL EXAMPLES OF RECORDS FROM NECHAMA'S LIST:

### **RUSSIA/UKRAINE**

TITLE Метрические книги, 1837-1920 (110 film notes)

SUMMARY Records of births, marriages, divorces, and deaths from the Jewish community in

Cherkassy, Cherkassy, Kiev, Russia; later known as Cherkasy, Cherkasy, Cherkasy, Ukraine. Included are records from Jewish communities in Russkaia Poliana, Lomovatoe, Zmagaĭlovka, Les'ki, Dakhnovka, and other neighboring towns.

## **AUSTRIA/POLAND/UKRAINE**

TITLE Metrical books, 1820-1939 (108 film notes)

SUMMARY Jewish records (births, marriages, deaths) for congregations in Galizien, Austria;

later in Poland; now in L'viv, Ternopil' and Ivano-Frankivs'k districts, Ukraine. Most film notes cover inclusive dates and events may be missing for some years. An archival register is found on film with GS# 2405309, item 18. Record group 701,

series 1, files 1-364.

#### CZECHOSLOVAKIA/HUNGARY

TITLE Židovské záznamy, 1852-1942

SUMMARY Jewish synagogue registers of births, marriages, deaths for Kremnica, Slovakia;

formerly Körmöczbánya, Bars, Hungary.

TITLE Židovské záznamy, 1843-1945

SUMMARY Jewish records of births, marriages, and deaths for Nitra, Slovakia; formerly Nyitra

(a.k.a. Neutra, Nitra, Nitria, Nytra), Nyitra, Hungary. Includes name indexes.

Includes also locality index.

### CZECHOSLOVAKIA/HUNGARY/SLOVAKIA

TITLE Matrika Inclusive Dates 1817-1948

SUMMARY Jewish records of births, marriages, and deaths for Dunajská Streda, Dunajská

Streda, Slovakia; formerly Dunaszerdahely (a.k.a. Ujfalu Elötejed, Nemesszeg, Szerdahely, Serdahely, Duna-Szerdahely), Pozsony, Hungary; and Dunajská Streda,

Dunajská Streda, Slovensko, Czechoslovakia. Includes indexes.

#### **GREAT BRITAIN**

TITLE School registers for the Jewish public school, Manchester, 1874-1927

SUMMARY School admission registers include date of birth, date of admission, residence or

address, and parent's name. Includes indexes.

TITLE Admissions and discharges from London City Union Workhouses, 1860-1932

SUMMARY Each entry contains names, ages, last residence before admission by civil ward,

condition (single, widow, widower, etc.), occupation, if able-bodied, by whose order

admitted, date of admission, date of discharge, and how or by whose order discharged. The names were arranged alphabetically by surname, by the first letter

of the surname only, and also by date of admission. Registers by 1908 were

arranged by admission date and contain similar information with the addition of year of birth, which union or parish admitted from, which union or parish discharged to.
